Flurries from Chris

More often than not the season between Christmas and Lent has congregations in a holding pattern. Where we really settle into an attitude of rest and waiting until spring arrives. But that is not the case for us this year, because there is a lot happening for us as a congregation.

First we have received approval through a grant process to have all of the lights inside and out of our building upgraded to LED's. A project that would normally cost us close to \$19,000 and yet our out of pocket cost is expected to be \$1,000. This project will help to lower our energy costs while also replacing burned out lightbulbs in the sanctuary and addressing other lighting concerns throughout our property.

North Hill is many good The soup January 29th was share food and




blessed to have cooks among us. luncheon on a great time to fellowship.

Changes in Worship

You may have noticed this past Sunday we made some fairly significant changes to how we do a very important part of our worship service. How we



receive your offerings and share in communion.

After much conversation and deliberation we are testing the waters of returning to "passing the plates."

I wanted to share some of the reasonings behind this change. The main reason is to limit the amount of times in our services and the life of the church where there is a separation based on physical abilities. While I have tried my best to limit language that denotes a separation when participating at the table, adapting our language never quite felt like a complete solution. The second is returning to the mindset of serving one another that is missed when we simply receive communion from the table.

As we test the waters of returning to passing the plates we could use your help as you are able. The first is to help in serving those in the pew with you. If someone is having difficulty, help them. The second is that there will still only be one deacon scheduled to serve each week where they will prepare the elements for us. There may be days where we need help passing the plates in the pews. If you are able we would welcome your assistance in passing the plates on Sunday mornings.
